### **Read Frachetti et al (2010)**

#### Notes

I have blocked out parts that you don't need to read in order to adequately answer the exam question. Many pages are missing but the complete article, if you want it, is on the class website.

When the authors say "south-west Asia" they are talking about the Levant and the northern part of the Fertile Crescent as well as farming north of the Fertile Crescent. The "Eurasian steppe" is from just north of the Black Sea in the Ukraine extending to just northwest of the Yellow Sea in China.
